**237. The Town Council will consider accepting an Advancing Community Policing Grant, and take any appropriate action. (Manager)**

This item is on the agenda at the request of the Police Department. Brunswick was 1 of 117 communities in the U.S. to get this grant. Commander Annese has provided information on what the grant will be used for and he will be at your meeting to answer questions.

**Councilor moved, Councilor seconded, to accept the Advancing Community Policing Grant as awarded. The motion carried with nine (9) yeas.**

**238. The Town Council will consider setting a public hearing to amend the No-Parking Ordinance on a regular basis relative to McKeen Street. (Manager)**

This item is also on the agenda at the request of the Police Department. The request is to amend the No-Parking section of the Ordinance. Since May 27, 1997 there has been No-Parking on the south side of McKeen Street from Maine Street westerly 200.' We have received only positive comments. The home and/or property owners are now requesting that the area of No-Parking be extended by 322 feet (or 522 feet total). A public hearing would need to be scheduled for January 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Councilor moved, Councilor seconded, to schedule a public hearing for January 20, 1997 to consider amending the No-Parking section of the Ordinance relative to McKeen Street. The motion carried with nine (9) yeas.**

**239. The Town Council will consider approval of the 6-month Beano and Games of Chance license renewals. (Manager)**

This is the 6-month renewals for Beano and Games of Chance for the Elks, 55 Plus Center, Knights of Columbus and Evergreen Senior Citizens. The Evergreens are currently holding their games in Topsham due to the loss of their building to fire. However, they contacted us and asked that we continue to renew their license for

Brunswick as they hope to be back in their building in February.

**Councilor moved, Councilor seconded, to renew the 6-month Beano and Games of Chance licenses for Elks Club, 55 Plus Center, Knights of Columbus and Evergreen Senior Citizens. The motion carried with nine (9) yeas.**

**240. The Town Council will discuss the possible disposition of Lot #39 on Map 32. (Manager)**

I recently received a letter from Alan Hummer (copy in agenda packet) concerning Lot #39, on Map 32, known as the "school house lot". Evidently this property was deeded to the Town in the early 1900's. We were not aware that the Town owned this property and Mr. Hummer's father has been paying taxes on this property for over 40 years. It is our recommendation that the Town deed this property to Alan Hummer.

**241. The Town Council will consider approving the requests of the Maine Association of USA Track & Field to hang a banner over Maine Street from June 29, 1998 through July 6, 1998 to promote the Maine Distance Festival Invitational Meet. (Manager)**

This is a request from the Maine Association of USA Track and Field to hang a banner over Maine Street from June 29-July 6, 1998. This will promote the Maine Distance Festival invitational track met to be held on July 4<sup>th</sup> at the Bowdoin College track to benefit Maine Special Olympics. We would recommend approval.

**Councilor moved, Councilor seconded, to approve the request of the Maine Association of USA Track and Field to hang a banner over Maine Street from June 29, 1998 to July 6, 1998. The motion carried with nine (9) yeas.**
